



- Windows® XP (service pack 1 or higher) or Windows Vista™ or Windows® 7
- Internet Explorer 6.0 or higher with Internet access
- · Windows Media Player 10 or higher
- · 250MB or more free hard disk space for the software
- · 128MB RAM (256MB recommended)
- · CD-ROM drive capable of digital audio extraction
- USB port (2.0 recommended)
- · Sound card

Subscription music transfer requirements

The player must be in MTP mode for subscription (DRM) music content transfer. Refer to page 31 for instruction on how to change Protocol modes.

Connecting to the computer

- · Connect the player to your computer with the USB cable provided. The player will turn on automatically.
- The player will be connected in MSC (Mass Storage Class) mode. It will appear as a drive letter on your computer and behave as a detachable drive for file transfer in one or both directions.
- The RCA easyRipTM Media Software installer is stored on the player. Go to My Computer in the Start menu, find and open the drive letter associated with the player (i.e. RCA MP3) and then double-click the rcaeasyrip_setup.exe file to launch the installer.
- The software installer can be deleted from the player after installation to free up more storage space*.



The player must be in **MSC** mode to run the RCA easyRip installer from the player. Your player is in MSC mode by default. You can change modes by selecting **Protocol** in the **Settings** menu.



- It may take several seconds for the player to be detected. Click View -> Refresh in My Computer or Windows Explorer to make sure the player has been detected.
- The player is capable of transferring files at USB 2.0. If a USB 2.0 port is available on your
 computer, use it to connect to your player. The player is still backward compatible with the
 older USB 1.1 ports; however, you will not be able to take full advantage of the potential speed
 increase.
- IMPORTANT: Do not disconnect the USB cable from either the PC or the player during the software installation.

Charging the player

The player charges automatically every time you connect it to your computer. To fully charge the player, make sure your computer is on and the player is connected for at least 3 hours. Refer to the battery level icon on the display to check the battery level. Recharge the player when the icon is empty.

Managing files on your RCA Player

Before you begin using your RCA player, you'll want to copy your media files to the player. You can use any of the following methods to transfer content:

- RCA easyRip
- Drag and drop files using Windows Explorer
- · Software provided by online music stores

The player must be in MTP mode for subscription content transfer. Use the software provided by the online music store for content transfer. Refer to page 31 for instruction on how to change Protocol modes.

- Video files must be converted and transferred via RCA easyRip for playback on your player.
- Video, photo, and audiobooks must be transferred while the player is in MSC mode to their respective folders on the player to ensure proper detection and playback.



Using RCA easyRip

easyRip lets you:

- Import music from CDs
- · Organize your music library on your PC
- Create playlists
- Copy files from your library to the player
- Copy files from the player to your library
- · Delete files from the player

To start easyRip:

- Click on the RCA Detective system tray icon and select RCA easyRip from the menu.
- Double-click the easyRip icon on your PC's desktop. The easyRip dock appears at the side of your screen.

Using Windows Explorer

To copy files in MSC mode:

1. Open the player in Windows Explorer.



RCA MP3 (Et)

2. Drag and drop music files into the Music folder and picture files into the Photo folder.



To copy files in MTP mode:

1. Open the player in Windows Explorer



2. Open Internal Storage.



3. Drag and drop music files.

Deleting files from the player

You may delete any files transferred to the player.

- 1. Connect the player to your computer.
- 2. Open the player in Windows Explorer and then navigate to the folder containing the files.
- 3. Select the files you want to remove and then press the Delete key on the keyboard of your PC.
- It is best to remove subscription files from the player by using Windows Media Player.

Disconnecting the player from the PC

If the player is mounted in MTP mode:

• Unplug the player from the PC when no file transfer is in progress.


If the player is mounted in MSC mode:

- 1. In the Windows system tray, click the **Safely Remove Hardware** icon sand then select the device with the appropriate drive letter from the list of devices.
- 2. When the Safe to remove hardware message appears, unplug the player from the PC.

IMPORTANT: Do not disconnect the USB connection during file transfer. Doing so may corrupt system files or the files being transferred.



General controls



Turning the player on and off

Turn player on/off: Slide and hold the Power/Lock Slider (७/🖺) towards from the headphone jack.

Locking the player controls

Lock player controls: Slide the Power/Lock Slider (७/🖹) away from the headphone jack.

 When the controls are locked, ock icon will flash on the display three times if any buttons are pressed.

Unlock player controls: Slide the Power/Lock Slider (७/♠) toward the middle position.

Resetting the player

If the player stops operating properly, you can reset it by pressing the **RESET** button on the back of the player with a non-metal pointed object (e.g. toothpick).

Using the menus


Menu types

The player has two menu types:

Player menu

The player menu appears when you turn on the player or if you press and hold to while listening to the player. It lets you:

- Browse for and play music, audiobook, video and picture files
- Listen to the radio
- Record and play back voice memos
- Change the player's settings language, display brightness, etc.



Menu items

Option menu

The option menu appears if you press 🛘 at the playback (Now Playing) screen while listening to the player. It provides different options depending on what you are listening to when you press 🗐.



Option Menu (Now Playing)

Menu navigation

When a menu is displayed:

- Press + and to scroll up and down the list of menu items.
- Press III to go to the next menu level. Press to return to the previous menu level.



• If the highlighted item is playable (for example, an audio file), press № to start playback.



• If the highlighted item indicates the current setting (for example, the repeat mode setting), press PII to change the setting.



The Home menu

The top-level or "Home" menu is always displayed when you press and hold . The menu options are:



Audiobooks

Press II to enter the Audiobook menu and choose a particular audiobook for listening.



Radio

Press III to enter the Radio menu and choose to either listen to the radio or play vrecordings of previous radio shows.



Voice memo

Press >11 to enter the Voice memo menu and choose to either start recording or play recordings of previous voice memo.



Videos

Press ▶II to enter the Videos menu and choose a particular video for viewing.



Music

Press ▶II to enter the Music menu and choose an artist, album, genre or individual title.



Pictures

Press ▶II to enter the Pictures menu and choose a particular image for viewing.



Settinas

Press ▶II to enter the Settings menu, which lets you:

- · Choose the shuffle playback mode
- Choose a repeat playback mode
- Choose an equalizer setting
- · Customize the music menu
- Set the slideshow image duration
- · Change the screen brightness
- Change the screensaver setting
- Choose the power saving setting
- Choose a record duration setting
- Switch between US and European radio frequency steps
- Change the language of the player's menus
- Switch between MTP and MSC modes
- · Perform sorting to all music files.
- Display the firmware version, space used, and space available
- · Reset the player's settings to the factory defaults
- Format device to cleanup all data and old license file



Favorites

As you listen to music, you can add individual titles to a "favorites" playlist. Press ▶II to enter the Favorites menu and choose a particular title or edit the playlist.



Now Playing

Available only during playback.

Press ▶II to return to the currently playing file.

Music

Playing music files
The player sorts your music files by track name (title), artist, album and genre.

1. In the Home menu, press + or − and I≪ or ≫I to navigate to Music.



Note: In other playback modes, press and hold ⁵ to return to the Home menu.



- 2. Press III to enter Music mode.
- 3. Use + or and IK or >> I to navigate through the menus and highlight the desired item, then press >> I or In to start listening.

Option menu (music playback)

Press at the playback (Now Playing) screen to show the Option menu. Press + or – to highlight an option and then press I to confirm the selection or change the setting.

The following options are available:

- Add to Favorites Adds the current file to the Favorites playlist (read page 26). Each file can be added
 to the Favorites playlist multiple times.
- **Repeat** Toggles repeat mode. Options available: Off, One **C** , and All **C** (corresponding icons show on the display).
- **Shuffle** Toggles shuffle mode. Plays media randomly when shuffle is On.
- Album Art Toggles album art display.
- Equalizer Toggles equalizer mode. Options available: Flat, Bass, Pop, Rock and Jazz.
- **Delete** Deletes the currently playing media file from the player.

Music playback display



- 1. Current file number/total number of files
- 2. Song name
- 3. Artist name
- 4. Album name
- 5. Elapsed playback time
- 6. File total time
- 7. Playback progress bar
- 8. File bitrate
- 9. File type

The information provided in the playback screen depends upon the ID3 tags that have been set up for the music file.

Videos

Playing video files

1. In the Home menu, press + or − and I≪ or ≫I to navigate to **Videos**.



Note: In other playback modes, press and hold \circlearrowleft to return to the Home menu.



- 2. Press III to enter Video mode.
- 3. Use + or − and I≪ or ≫I to navigate through the menus and highlight the desired item, then press ≫I or №I to start viewing.

Video viewing



K	Goes back, skips backward. Press and hold to scan backwards within a file
>> I	Advances, skips forward. Press and hold to scan forward within a file
ÞII	Starts/pauses playback
+ or -	Increases or decreases the volume during playback
	Shows/hides option menu

Option menu (video playback)

Press ▶II to pause the video playback. Press I to show the Option menu. Press + or – to highlight an option and then press ▶II to confirm the selection or change the setting.

The following option is available:

Delete – Deletes the selected video

Video files must be converted to optimal format for playback on this player. The RCA easyRip Media Software converts the video files automatically before transferring to the player.



Pictures

Playing picture files

1. In the Home menu, press + or − and I≪ or ≫I to navigate to **Pictures**.



Note: In other playback modes, press and hold ⁵ to return to the Home menu.



- 2. Press III to enter Picture mode.
- 3. Use + or − and I≪ or ≫I to navigate through the menus and highlight the desired item, then press ≫I or №I to start viewing.

Picture viewing

Option menu (picture viewing)

Press II to pause the picture playback. Press II to show the Option menu. Press + or - to highlight an option and then press II to confirm the selection or change the setting.

The following options are available:

- **Slideshow Timing**—Toggles time to show each picture during a slideshow. Options available: Off, 3s, 5s, 10s, 15s
- **Delete** Deletes the selected picture

Refer to page 11 for transferring picture files to the player.



Audiobooks

Playing audiobooks Audiobook playback is similar to music playback.

1. In the Home menu, press + or − and K or >> I to navigate to Audiobooks.




Note: In other playback modes, press and hold つ to return to the Home menu.



- 2. Press III to enter Audiobook mode.
- 3. Use + or and IK or >> I to navigate through the menus and highlight the desired item, then press >> I or bil to start listening.

Option menu (Audiobook playback)

Press I at the playback (Now Playing) screen to pause the playback and press (now the Option menu. Press + or – to highlight an option and then press I to confirm the selection or change the setting.

The following options are available:

- Skip –Skips section-by-section or file-by-file (See Skipping through audiobook sections for more information)
- **Delete** Deletes the selected audiobook

Skipping through audiobook sections

If the currently playing audiobook contains sections, you can choose to skip forward and backward between sections when you press ⊶, instead of skipping between files.

To choose section-by-section skipping:

- 1. Press III to pause playback and press 🗏 to display the Option menu.
- 2. Press + or to select **Skip**, then press **PII** to switch to **Section**.
- 3. Press 🗉 to resume playback.
- Section-by-section skipping is indicated by **Sect** on the display. Press っ or 目 to resume playback screen.
- · The player returns to file-by-file skipping automatically when you play another file or turn the player off.

Radio

The radio uses the earphones as an antenna. For better reception, extend the earphone cable as far as possible.



Playing FM radio

To turn the radio on:

1. In the Home menu, press + or − and K or >> I to navigate to Radio.



Note: In other playback modes, press and hold っ to return to the Home menu.



- 2. Press III to enter Radio mode.
- 3. While Listen is highlighted, press >> I or >> I to start listening. The frequency screen appears.

To tune the radio:

- Press and hold K or ≫I to start scanning through the frequency range. The player stops scanning when it
 detects the next station.
- Press I≪ or ≫I to step through the frequency range.

To turn the radio off:

- · Turn the player off
- In other modes, press and hold to display the Home menu and select other modes.

Storing and recalling preset stations

You can store up to 20 preset stations in the player.

To store the currently playing station as a preset:

- 1. Press 🗏 to display the Option menu.
- 2. Press + or to highlight Save to Preset and then press III.
- If all 20 preset station numbers are occupied, you will replace the existing station with the new station.
- 3. The first available preset number is displayed. Press + or to select a different preset number if desired.
- If you choose a preset number that already contains an FM station, you will replace the existing station
 with the new station.
- 4. Press >> to highlight Yes and then press >> 1

To listen to a preset station:

1. When the radio is playing, press 🗏 to display the Option menu.

- 2. Press + or to highlight **Tuning** and press III to switch from **Manual** to **Preset**.
- 3. Press っ or to exit the menu.
- 4. Press K or ≫I to choose the desired station preset number.

Improving FM radio sound

If stereo reception is noisy, you can often reduce the noise by switching to mono.

To switch between stereo and mono:

- 1. While the radio is playing, press 🗉 to display the Option menu.
- 2. Press + or to highlight **Mode** and then press **P**II to switch between **Stereo** and **Mono**.
- 3. Press ♥ or 🗏 to exit the menu.

Recording FM radio

You can record the radio and play back recordings as well as copy the recordings (WAV files) to your PC.

To record the currently playing radio station:

- 1. Press 🗉 to display the Option menu.
- 2. Press + or to highlight Start Recording and then press >11 to start recording.
- Press III to pause or resume recording.
- Press
 and then select Stop Recording by pressing ▶II. The player names each recording FMXXXXXX.WAV,
 where XXXXXX is a unique number.

Playing back FM radio recordings

To play back a recording:

- 1. In other modes, press and hold to display the Home menu.
- 2. Press + or − and KK or >> I to select **Radio** and press >> II to enter the radio menu.
- 3. Press + or to highlight **Playback** and press) or bilto see the list of recordings.
- 4. Press + or − to select a recording and press >> or >> to start playback.

Copying recordings to your PC

Recordings are stored as WAV files in the "RADIOREC" folder on the player.

To copy recordings to the PC:

- 1. Plug the player into the PC.
- 2. Open the player's Record folder.
- 3. Select the files you want to copy and drag and drop them onto a folder on the PC.
- Almost all audio applications can play WAV files.

Favorites

Creating a "Favorites" playlist

You can create a playlist of your favorite music by adding new files to the playlist as you listen to them. This function is not available for other media formats such as videos, pictures, audiobooks and recordings.

To add the currently playing music file in the playlist:

- 1. Press 1 to display the Option menu.
- 2. Press + or to highlight Add to Favorites and then press ▶II.
- · Added Successfully shows on the display.
- Repeat the above steps for adding more music files.

To listen to the Favorites playlist:

1. In the Home menu, press + or − and I≪ or >> I to navigate to Favorites.



Note: In other playback modes, press and hold っ to return to the Home menu.



- 2. Press III to enter Favorites mode.
- Use + or and I≪ or ≫I to navigate through the menus and highlight the desired item, then press ≫I or
 It to start listening.

Removing files from "Favorites" playlist

To remove all music files from the playlist:

1. In the Home menu, press + or − and I≪ or >> I to navigate to Favorites.



- 2. Press III to enter Favorites mode.
- 3. Press + or to highlight My Selection and press All.
- 4. Press + or − to select the desired file and press >> I or >> I to start playback.
- 5. Press 🗉 to display the Option menu. Now "Clear from Favorites" is highlighted.
- 6. Press II to remove this file from the playlist.

Downloading playlists to player

You can also download playlists of your favorite music created on the RCA easyRip software. Please refer to the Help module in easyRip for details on creating playlists and transferring the created playlists to the player.

Voice Memo

Recording voice memo

You can record voice and play back recordings as well as copy the recordings (WAV files) to your PC.

To record voice:

1. In the Home menu, press + or − and I≪ or >> I to navigate to Voice Memo.



Note: In other playback modes, press and hold 5 to return to the Home menu.



- 2. Press III to enter Voice Memo mode.
- 3. Press >>| or >|| to highlight Start Recording and press >>| or >|| to start recording.
- Press III to pause or resume recording.
- The microphone is located at the back of the player.
- 4. Press and then select **Stop Recording** by pressing MI.
- The player names each recording MICxxxxx.wav, where xxxxx is a unique number.

To record for a specific duration:

Playing back voice memo

To play back a recording:

- 1. In the Home menu, press + or − and I≪ or >> I to navigate to Voice Memo.
- 2. Press III to enter Voice Memo mode.
- 3. Use + or − and IK or >> I to navigate through the menus and highlight the desired item, then press >> I or >> I to start listening.

Copying recordings to your PC

Recordings are stored as WAV files in the "VOICEREC" folder on the player.

To copy recordings to the PC:

- 1. Plug the player into the PC.
- 2. Open the player's Record folder.
- 3. Select the files you want to copy and drag and drop them onto a folder on the PC.
- · Almost all audio applications can play WAV files.

Settings

Changing the player's settings

To change the player settings:

1. In the Home menu, press + or – and \mathbb{K} or \mathbb{N} to navigate to **Settings**.

Shuffle

Tips and troubleshooting

Cannot delete files on the player.

- You can delete files on the player using your computer.
 - 1. Connect the player to your computer.
 - 2. Open the player in Windows Explorer and navigate to the folder containing the files.
 - 3. Select the files you want to remove and then press the Delete key on the keyboard of your PC.
- For deleting files from the player, refer to Option menu from page 17-29 for details.
- For deleting files using easyRip, click the Help module on easyRip's Module Dock.

Player repeats same tracks or all tracks.

• Repeat play is turned on. Press ⓓ during playback to show the Option menu and select Repeat Off. You can also press ⋾ to return to the Home menu. Then select **Settings** and press ы to enter the settings menu to select Repeat Off.

Audio distorted at high volume.

- · Change the Equalizer mode to Flat.
- · Turn down the volume.

The audio tracks on my player keep skipping or popping.

- You'll need to rip the audio track again make sure you close all other applications on your PC when you
 record.
- Try ripping with the Error Correction setting turned on.

Player turns itself off.

 Your player turns itself off if you leave it in pause mode or navigation mode for the duration specified in PowerSave setting.

The player cannot be turned on.

- · Battery is empty, please recharge.
- Ensure the Power/Lock Slider is not in the Lock position.
- Reset the player by pressing the RESET button on the back of the player with a non-metal pointed object (e.g. toothpick)."
 - If the player still cannot be turned on after resetting, perform a firmware upgrade to restore it.

Player does not respond to key presses.

- Make sure the lock function is not activated.

Cannot launch RCA easyRip installer stored in the player to install easyRip on my PC.

The player must be in MSC mode to run the RCA easyRip installer from the player. You can change modes
by selecting Protocol in the Settings menu.

Cannot find the content in computer after connected the player.

- Contents copied into the Player in MSC mode can only be found in MSC mode when connected to computer. If player is switched to MTP mode, these contents will not be displayed.
