## Using armband/wristband

Slide the small ends of the armband or wristband through the player's rings and secure with the buttons as shown below. Adjust the length of the armband if necessary. The length of the wristband is not adjustable.


## Software setup

The Music Management CD that comes with your player contains all of the necessary software components you need to make your player work properly.

These components enable you to transfer files from your computer to the player.

Inserting the included CD into CD Drive

1. Turn on your computer and place the Music Management CD that came with your player into your computer.
IMPORTANT: Do not connect the USB cable to the PC or the player before or during the $C D$ installation.
2. If the setup screen does not appear, double-click "My Computer", double click your CD drive icon, and double click "RCA Installer.exe" to run the installer.

The Music Management CD also contains a software package Yahoo! Music ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ Jukebox that can help transfer music content to your player. Please refer to the section on your installed software for detailed operations.

Yahoo! Music ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ Jukebox is supported in Windows® XP or Windows Vista ${ }^{\text {TM }}$.

## Computer connection

## Connecting the player and wireless earphones to the computer

Connect the player to your computer with the mini USB cable provided. The player will turn on automatically. It will appear as a Windows portable device (Windows Vista ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ or Windows® XP with Windows Media Player 10 installed) using the Media Transfer Protocol (MTP) or a drive letter if you are using Windows® 2000.

It might take several seconds for the player to be detected. Click "Refresh" in My Computer or Explorer to make sure the player has been detected.

The player is capable of transferring files at USB 2.0. If USB 2.0 port is available on your computer, use it to connect to your player. The player is still backward compatible with the older USB 1.1 ports. However, you will not be able to take full advantage of the potential speed increase.

The mini USB cable also includes the charger for the wireless earphones so that both the player and the earphones can be charged at the same time. Attach the left earphone to the charger for charging. Wireless earphones cannot be operated during charging. Refer to the illustration below for details.


## Computer connection

## Charging the player

Your player will charge through the USB connection when it is connected to your computer. The display below shows where the animated battery icon is displayed when charging. To fully charge the player, make sure your computer is on and the device is connected for at least 3 hours.


- After a short while any message is shown on the display, a screensaver will be activated. Press any button to de-activate the screensaver and read the message again.
- You can still transfer files to the player while in battery charging mode.
- When the battery is full, the display shows "Battery full".


## Charging the wireless earphones

The wireless earphones will charge through the charger attached to the USB cable. Refer to the previous page for connecting the earphones to the charger.


Refer to the color of the LED indicator for charging status:

## Important battery information

- Charge the player and the wireless earphones for at least 3 hours before first use.
- Charge the player and the wireless earphones for at least 3 hours after putting the player away for a long time.
- Battery replacement should only be made by trained technicians. Refer to Limited Warranty for details.
- Do not attempt to open the player. There are no user serviceable parts inside.
- To reduce risk of injury, charge only rechargeable batteries recommended by the manufacturer for this player. Other types of batteries may burst causing damage and personal injury.


## Caution

- Do not separately recharge, disassemble, or incinerate or expose to high temperatures over $45^{\circ} \mathrm{C}\left(113^{\circ} \mathrm{F}\right)$. ## Transferring files to the player

Yahoo! Music ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ Jukebox is supported only by Windows® XP or Windows Vista ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ operating system.

Secure music download files must be transferred to your player through the Yahoo Music ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ Jukebox or the application recommended by your online music download service (Note: Services and applications must be Windows Media audiocompliant and support Digital Rights Management.) 1. Launch the Yahoo! Music ${ }^{T M}$ Jukebox.
2. Attach the player to your computer. The player's name should appear after a few seconds in the left navigation pane.
3. In the Yahoo! Music ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ Jukebox, click My Music or click on a playlist on the left navigation pane.
4. Simply drag the playlist you want to the name of your player in the left navigation pane (you can also drag tracks, artists and albums directly from My Music).
5. The Yahoo! Music ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ Jukebox will check to see if there is sufficient storage space on the player to copy the songs. If not, you will have to reduce the number of songs you are transferring.

## Transferring files to the player

## Transferring files via Windows Explorer (Drag-and-drop)

## In Windows® XP (with Windows Media Player 10 installed)

In Windows® XP and when Windows Media Player 10 is installed, the player is connected to the computer in MTP mode. In the Windows Explorer, when the player is opened, the "Data" and "Media" views will be displayed for the player. The Data folder is used to manage data content on the player, such as text files. The Media folder is used to manage media content supported by the player for playback, such as mp 3 and wma.


You can copy files to the player through Windows Explorer (drag-and-drop). Picture files should be copied to the "Media" folder for viewing while video files cannot be dragged and copied to the "Media" folder directly.

The video files must be converted and transferred via RCA Video Converter for playback (refer to page 25). Alternatively, you can transfer the converted video files to the "Data" folder via the Windows Explorer (drag-and-drop).

You can copy files to / delete files from the player through Windows Explorer, but you cannot open or edit the files directly from the player. If you want to edit the files, you will need to copy the files from the player to another location (drive) in the system.

## In Windows® 2000 or Windows® XP (without Windows Media Player 10 or above installed)

If Windows Media Player 10 or above is not installed in Windows® XP, or your computer is running Windows® 2000, the player is connected to the computer in MSC mode. You can transfer files via the Windows Explorer (drag-and-drop).

From Windows Explorer, highlight all the files/folders you want to transfer to your player and drag them to the drive letter that is associated with it.

Picture files should be copied to the root directory for viewing while video files cannot be dragged and copied to the player directly. The video files must be converted and transferred to the player via RCA Video Converter for playback (refer to page 25). Alternatively, you can transfer the coverted video files to the root directory.


In Windows® XP or Windows Vista ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ (with Windows Media Player 11 or above installed)
If your computer has installed Windows Media Player 11, "Internal Storage" shows instead of the folders mentioned above. Copy files inside "Internal Storage".


## Transferring files to the player

- Video files must be converted by the RCA Video Converter and can be transferred to the player via the converter for playback (refer to page 25).
- Secure music download files must be transferred to your player through one of the provided Jukebox software packages or any applications recommended by the online music download service. Please visit the online music download service's website where you purchased your content from for more details on transferring secure music to your player.


## Deleting files from the player

For any files you have transferred to the player, you may delete them while you have connected the player with your computer. Highlight the unwanted file in the player's file directory on your computer and press the delete key on your computer to delete the file. It is best to remove Yahoo! Music ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ subscription files from the player by using the Yahoo! Music ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ Jukebox.

## Disconnecting your player from the computer

For Windows Vista ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ or Windows® XP (with Windows Media Player 10 or above installed), your player is connected in MTP mode to your computer by default, you may disconnect the USB cable directly when file download is completed.

For Windows® 2000 or Windows® XP users without Windows Media Player 10 or above installed, your player is connected in MSC mode. Your player will appear as a drive letter on your computer. You can disconnect the player by left clicking on the icon from the system tray and selecting the drive corresponding to your player. Before disconnecting the USB connection from the computer or the player, be sure the "Safe to Remove Hardware" message is displayed.

## General controls

## Turning on or off the player

- Press and hold $\rightarrow \|$ to turn on the player.
- Press and hold $>\|$ to turn off the player.


## Locking the keys

Press and hold $\mathbf{m}$ to lock (or unlock) keys to prevent accidental key activation.
To unlock the keys after the screensaver has activated, press $\|_{l}$ and then press and hold $\mathbf{m}$ while the message "Press and hold $m$ to unlock" is displayed.

## Menus

## Types of menu

There are two types of menu:

1. Player menu


The player menu allows you to:

- browse for music, audible, picture and video files for playback,
- listen to the radio,
- access the pedometer, stopwatch and BMI (Body Mass Index) functions,
- adjust the player's settings (e.g. brightness, language),
- check the system firmware version and memory usage.

2. Option menu


The option menu allows you to:

- delete files, add music files in your favorite playlist (My Selections), save radio frequency as preset station etc.
- The actual items available depend on the mode or type of file you are playing (e.g.
music, radio, audiobooks) by the time you access the option menu.


## Accessing the menus

Press $\mathbf{m}$ to access the player and option menus.

When the player is playing or paused:


When the player is neither playing nor paused. This happens when the player is turned on and no file is selected for playback.


## Menus

## Menu navigation

Refer to below for browsing through the menus and read the following pages for detailed explanation of them.

- Press $\rightarrow l l$ or $\gg$ to go to the next menu level. If the selected item is a media file (music, picture etc) or a playable item (Artists, Albums etc. in the music menu), press $\|_{l}$ will start playback.
- Press + or - to move along menu items at the same level.
- Press 14 to go to the previous menu level.
- If the selected item indicates the current setting, press $\boldsymbol{\|}$ to change it.

More menu items available, press $\boldsymbol{\| l}$ or to advance

The following example illustrates the steps to select and play a music file in the "Artists" category.

1. Highlight "Music" by pressing + or - , then press $M$ to advance.

2. Highlight "Artists" by pressing + or - , then press $M$ to advance.

3. The artist menu appears with the artists listed in alphabetical order. Highlight a desired artist by pressing + or - , then press M to advance.

4. The albums of the selected artist appear. Highlight a desired album by pressing + or - , then press $M$ to advance.

5. The songs of the selected album appear. Highlight a desired song by pressing + or -, then press $\|_{\|}$to start playback.

- The song's information will show on the display during playback. The information available depends upon the ID3 tags that have been set up for the song.


## Player menu

Files transferred to the player are sorted automatically according to their file types. Once your player is switched on, you will see the player menu as below. The player menu is displayed when $\mathbf{m}$ is pressed once during playback.


## Content of player menu

## Now Playing

- It is only available when the playback is in progress or paused. Select it to show the currently playing file.


## Music

- Music files are further sorted according to several parameters for quickly searching your favorite music. Press $>l l$ to start playback when a music file is highlighted. Refer to page 21 for details.


## Pictures

- It contains image files for playback. Press -ll to start playback when a picture file is highlighted. Refer to page 23 for details.


## Videos

- It contains video files for playback. Press -ll to start playback when a video file is highlighted. Refer to page 24 for details.


## Player menu

## Radio

- To listen to the radio or radio recordings. Refer to page 26-28 for details.


## Audiobooks

- It contains audible files for playback. Press -ll to start playback when an audible file is highlighted. Refer to page 29 for details.


## My Selections

- It contains a playlist of your preferred music files. Refer to page 22 for details.


## Pedometer

- Refer to page 31 for details on using the pedometer.


## Stopwatch

- Refer to page 32 for details on using the stopwatch.


## BMI

- Refer to page 33 for details on using the BMI calculator.


## Settings

- Press $m$ to enter the settings menu and then press + or - to highlight an item. Refer to the player for options available within each item. Press $>l l$ repeatedly to select options.
- Brightness: to adjust the display light brightness.
- Screensaver: to adjust the duration before the screensaver activates.
- Powersave: to adjust the duration for automatic shut down when the player is in idle.
- FreqStep (Frequency Step): to select between the US and Europe frequency mode.
- Language: to select the menu's language.
- Unit: to select between the English and metric unit system for entering personal information. Refer to page 31 for details.
- Personal Info: to input sex, weight, height and stride length for BMI calculation and the pedometer. Refer to page 31 for details.
- Flip Display: to rotate the display by $180^{\circ}$
- Purge Licenses: if you cannot add subscribed content into the player, you may need to clear up expired DRM licenses for
more disc space. After purging licenses, please synchronize again the player with the music management software (e.g. Yahoo! Music ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ Jukebox) for updating the licenses.
- Restore Defaults: to restore all menus to factory defaults.


## System Info

- Press $\boldsymbol{\| l}$ or H to show the amount of free space available and the firmware version.

For explanation of the option menu, please refer to the following sections regarding various features (e.g radio, pedometer) of the player. Items available in the option menu vary from each feature.

## Music playback

## Music playback controls

Press to show the wireless
menu (refer to page 34-35).

Press once to skip to the previous file*, or press and hold to fast reverse.

Press once to start the playback. Press during playback to pause and again to resume.


Press to go to the option or player menu (refer to page 17). Press and hold to lock or unlock the keys.


To increase the volume

Press once to skip to the next file, or press and hold to fast forward.
To decrease the volume

* Press 144 within the beginning 4 seconds of the current file to skip to the previous file. Otherwise, you will return to the beginning of the current file.


## Music playback display



The information provided in the playback screen depends upon the metadata fields that have been set up for the song.

## Music playback

## My Selections

My Selections is a playlist of your preferred music files (audible and radio recorded files are not selectable).

## To select a music file as My Selections:

1. While listening to a favorite music file, press $\mathbf{m}$ twice to show the option menu.

To resume normal operation, it may be necessary to reset the earphones by pressing the RESET button on the right earphone with a non-metal pointed object (e.g. toothpick). Press and hold $\cup>\|$ on the right earphone to restart after the reset.

## Using other Kleer wireless earphones

Other Kleer earphones must be paired up with the player before first use. The earphones should be charged and placed near the player for connection. Make sure other wireless devices are turned off.

## Troubleshooting Tips

The player does not turn on when the PLAY button is pressed?

- Battery may be empty.
- Reset player by press \& hold $\rightarrow$ ll for 10 s or more, and power up the player again.

Skipping tracks or bad sound quality?

- Repeat, random or program function may be activated.
- There may be strong magnetic fields (e.g. too close to TV) near the player.
- Low Battery level.

Cannot perform playback?

- LOCK function may be activated.
- There may be no mp3/WMA tracks in the internal memory.

USB display does not appear when connected to computer?

- Check connection between your player and the computer.

Cannot playback tracks on the player.

- Make sure audio tracks are encoded in the mp3 or Windows Media formats at supported bitrates. Bitrates supported by the player:
mp3-32 to 320 kbps
wma - 48 to 192 kbps
- WMA files may be DRM protected and you do not have the proper rights (license) to play the files.
- Check the website and/or application help system of the music download service provider from where the content was purchased for license acquisition details. For more information on how license acquisition works, go to www.microsoft.com/windowsmedia/drm.
- Play the original or downloaded song on your computer to ensure that there was nothing wrong with the encoding of the mp3 or WMA.
- The player's clock is inaccurate. This may cause DRM files to work incorrectly. To fix the problems, connect the player to the computer using the USB cable. Then connect to the secure service where DRM encoded files came from. The clock should reset and DRM files should now work properly.

The player does not work after reformat.

- In case you need to reformat the player, it must be in FAT or FAT32 format. The player does not work in NTFS format.

The player cannot be recognized by Audible Manager

- Your previously installed Audible Manager may not work with this player. You have to reinstall Audible Manager completely by following the instruction from your CD which comes with the player.

Why can't my portable player playback songs downloaded from my paid Music Service Provider subscription service?

- The internal clock in your portable player may not be up to date. Downloading a new subscription song from your Music Service Provider should update your player's clock and allow it to playback all your songs again.
- The license for your subscription songs may have expired. Synchronize your device with your PC again to obtain an update to your license. If the problem persists, please contact your Music Service Provider for additional support.

Cannot access the player via Windows® 2000.

- Install the Service Pack 3 for Windows® 2000. Visit www.windowsupdate. microsoft.com for details.

Cannot delete files on the player.

- For any files you have transferred to the player, you may delete them while you have connected the player with your computer. Highlight the unwanted file in the player's file directory on your computer and press the delete key on your computer to delete the file. Subscribed files from Yahoo! Music ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ are best to be removed through Yahoo! Music ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ Jukebox.

- Make sure no other Kleer earphones are turned on.

This player may temporarily cease to function if subjected to electrostatic disturbance. To resume normal operation, press and hold $>1$ for longer than 10 seconds to reset the player. Press and hold U $\rightarrow l l$ on the right earphone to restart after the reset.
